Getting There

London Underground

Start at Hampstead Underground. The station is served by the Northern line. We recommend using Citymapper to plan your route to the station.





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Bathing Ponds

The Heath boast 4 beautiful open air swimming areas. There is a small fee to swim and the water quality is tested weekly. Don't forget your towel!

1 KENWOOD LADIES' POND

Opened in 1926, the Ladies' Bathing Pond is the only ladies' natural bathing pond in Europe. Open year round.

2 HIGHGATE MEN'S POND

The Men's pond was opened in 1901. During WWI & WWII, this pond was used by the army as a training ground.



3 MIXED BATHING POND

The mixed pond was the first pond to be opened in the Heath in the early 1800s.

4 PARLIAMENT HILL LIDO

Opened in 1938, the Lido is an unheated open air swimming pool, open 365 days a year.



Walk Summary

A 790 acre island of beautiful countryside, the magic of the Heath's nature is paired with extensive sport and recreational opportunities.

There is a zoo, athletics track, education centre, extensive children's facilities, three swimming ponds and a Lido. All of these are built to be accessible



and easy for all to get to! The views from Parliament Hill are so good, they make the journey on the Northern Line worth it, we promise!

Points of interest

HAMPSTEAD TUBE STATION

It's a 8 minute walk to the Heath. The platforms at this station are the deepest on the Underground at 192ft below the ground level.



THE SWIMMING PONDS

Originally dammed-off clay pits from the 18th century, these Ponds have entertained Londoners over 200 years.

FEMALE-ONLY SWIMMING POND



This old Victorian sensibility is valued by many and is one the few women-only spaces in London.

VIEW FROM PARLIAMENT HILL



Thought to be named after the Parliamentary forces that used the area as barracks in the English Civil War.



PARLIAMENT HILL LIDO

A short walk from Gospel Oak station and open year round. Brave in colder weather and enjoy the sauna!



KENWOOD HOUSE

Lord Iveagh (of the Guinness family), left the house to the nation upon his death in 1927.





THE BREW HOUSE

Wholesome café in a rustic room within the renowned stately home, plus a leafy garden terrace.



THE SPANIARDS INN

An unassuming pub tucked away in Hampstead Heath. Totally unpretentious and very cosy!



FINISH AT HAMPSTEAD TUBE STATION

If you have some time on your hands, Hampstead has lots of nice restaurants pubs to offer.






TAKING IT ALL IN

See these magnificent beetles in May-July in the Heath.






Extremely elusive and beautiful butterfly. Spot in July-August.
