Getting There



Train

If coming by train from the south, change at Leeds for the Airedale Line which has regular services to Skipton and takes approximately 50 minutes.



By Car

Parking in Skipton town centre can be busy in peak periods. The largest car parks are in Cavendish Street (BD23 2AB) and Skipton High Street Car Park (BD23 1ED)

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Hike Summary

This walk combines many of the characteristic landscapes of the southern Dales:

An initial gradual climb through moorland, with superb views back down the valley over the town, followed by a gentle descent



through rolling pasture. The Dales are perched between the mill towns of Yorkshire and Lancashire, two powerhouses of the Industrial Revolution. The last section of the walk takes you from Gargrave, a peaceful village, back to Skipton along the Leeds-Liverpool canal, one of the oldest canals in the world still in operation – once a bustling commercial waterway, and now a blissfully peaceful backdrop.

Points of interest

SKIPTON STATION

Built in 1876, Skipton railway station is a Grade II listed and serves 1 million passengers per year.



BEAN LOVED

The perfect pre-walk spot for a coffee or some food. We recommend the truffle mushrooms on sourdough with poached eggs!

SKIPTON CASTLE



One of the most complete and best preserved medieval castles in England and is well worth a visit!

SKIPTON CASTLE WOODS



If you have the time (and energy!), there is idilic circular path around these gardens that takes about an hour.

SHARP HAW

You'll find a trig point once you've reached the summit – 354 metres. Spectacular views in all directions!

FLASBY

This picturesque hamlet was the home to Fred Trueman, the great fast bowler.

ESHTON HALL

Just outside Flasby, you'll glimpse Eshton Hall, a Victorian manor house.

THE OLD SWAN, GARGAVE

If you fancy a stop half-way for some food or a drink take a 5km detour to The Old Swan in Gargave.




LEEDS-LIVERPOOL CANAL

Work began on building this canal in 1770, and it opened four years later. It boasts a impressive ninety-one locks.



FINISH IN SKIPTON

Bird's-eye Primrose

An endagered wildflower known for its healing powers.



This bird lives up to its name, standing at only 20cm tall!



Northern Brown Argus

A small, rare butterfly with a silvery appearance. Spot flying low on flowery grasslands.
